



Ambassador Gustavo Lunazzi is a career diplomat in the Foreign Service of the Argentine Republic. He currently serves as Ambassador of the Argentine Republic to the Swiss Confederation and the Principality of Liechtenstein, as well as Permanent Representative of Argentina to the World Trade Organization (WTO).

Since 1996, he has been involved in multilateral trade negotiations and disputes, either as a delegate in Geneva or as an official based in Buenos Aires. He has played an active role in most trade disputes involving Argentina, both within the WTO dispute settlement system and MERCOSUR. As Director of International Dispute Resolution at the Argentine Ministry of Foreign Affairs, he handled WTO disputes and defended the interests of Argentine exporters in frequent investigations on trade defense measures initiated by other countries (antidumping, subsidies, and safeguards).

He has served as a panelist in WTO dispute settlement panels, chaired the WTO Committee on Safeguards, and was a member of the WTO's Textile Monitoring Body (TMB). He also headed the Directorate of Institutional Affairs for MERCOSUR at the Argentine Ministry of Foreign Affairs. He was recently appointed Chair of the WTO Council for Trade in Goods.

In the past, he has also served at the Embassy of the Argentine Republic in the United States, where he was the Congressional Liaison, and at Argentina's Permanent Mission to International Organizations in Geneva.

Ambassador Gustavo Lunazzi was born in 1962 in Buenos Aires, Argentina, and is married.
